- 2) Who are people most at Maycomb, Alabama? Identify your impressions of Dill, Calpurnia, Jim, the narrator, Atticus, the Radleys, Miss Stephanie Crawford, and Miss Caroline Fisher.
- 3) What are some essential family values and family history that have shaped the people in the community?
- 4) What behaviors are acceptable in the Maycomb community? What behaviors are not acceptable in the community?
- 5) Which character infers Scout about proper behavior? How do these characters tell her to act?
- 6) What is Walter Cunningham like? What does his behavior during lunch suggest about his home life?
- 7) Describe Miss Caroline's interaction with Boo Radley. What does this suggest about Miss Caroline? What does this suggest about the Finch?
- 8) What do you think of the way Atticus treats Walter?
- 9) Does Scout learn anything from Walter's visit? What do you think this is?
- 10) Scout says that you never really understand a person "until you climb into his skin and walk around in it." What does this mean? What does this lesson suggest about Atticus? Is it an easy thing for Scout to learn?
